Language 201

Students must complete a foreign language through the 201 level or demonstrate proficiency at the 201 level by completing level IV or higher of a language in high school or obtain authorization of proficiency from the Department of Modern Languages and Linguistics (MLL). Corresponding test credit (AP, IB, or CLEP) may also satisfy this requirement.
