The annual Prague Proms International Music Festival presented audiences with high-quality performances across all genres, featuring both local and international artists. One of the highlights of the experience was performing in the great Smetana Hall of the Municipal House, a historic landmark and exceptional concert hall.

The three UMBC Choirs represented on the tour were the UMBC Camerata, conducted by Prof. Lulu Mwangi, and the UMBC Jubilee and Gospel Choir, conducted by Prof. Janice Jackson. 



Matt Belzer, Director of the Jazz Studies program and Teaching Professor in the Department of Music, has been awarded the 2025 CIRCA-IMET Artist-in-Residence Fellowship. During residency, Matt will consult with scientists at the Institute of Marine and Environmental Technology (IMET) understand to sensory systems, comparative life spans, and other biological and behavioral processes to create The Ocean is Aware, a proposed composed suite for an ensemble of creative musicians and a live performance. The musical material within the suite would be drawn from insights about the way sea life interacts with its environment, their perception of time, and their awareness of humans and each other. This performance could be documented as an audiovideo recording with the potential for later exhibition.

Dr. Lindsay Johnson recently presented her paper, "Celebrating Amateurism: Riffing on the Early Modern Salon," at the annual meeting of the Society for Seventeenth-Century Music, held at Yale University.

Dr. Linda Dusman's installation Infinite Transformations (in a Suitcase) is on the road this summer. It will appear at the COMPASS conference in Toronto, Canada, the Toronto Summer Music festival, and was installed in the Dillenschneider Gallery as part of the New York City Electroacoustic Music Festival in June. This work was created collaboratively with Prof. Foad Hamidi as part of an Imaging Research Center Fellowship, with significant creative partnership with Alan Wonneberger, Lee Boot, and Ryan Zuber.

Her video work Dream Prayer Observatory, a work created collaboratively with photographer Dan Bailey and UMBC violinist Airi Yoshioka, was also presented at the NYCEMF in June.
